Subject: 218 Lake Street West – Interim Use Permit and Variance

The City has received an interim use permit and variance application for review and consideration.

Overview of Request

The subject property is a parcel of record consisting of approximately .82 acres. The property is zoned C-2 Central Business District.

An interim use permit is requested in order to permit a masonry construction trade business or showroom. A proposed site plan has been provided.

No outside storage is shown on the site plan. The applicant has stated that on the concrete pad on the north side of the building he may be interested in placing racking to hold



vehicle attachments such as a snowplow blade and bobcat bucket. As no outside storage is currently shown on the site plan, he would need to apply for an amendment to the IUP at a later date and provide screening of the outside storage.

Business and employee vehicles may be parked on the cement and gravel parking areas shown on the plan. The applicant indicated that he currently has three employees driving three trucks with trailers for the business but is desiring to be able to increase the number of employees and associated vehicles in the future.

The applicant may also desire to construct an addition to the building in the future. Any additions will require amendments to the site plan and the Interim Use Permit.

The site plan identifies an existing building (no expansion proposed), concrete driveway, gravel parking area, and open space/yard. The existing gravel parking area is proposed to be reduced in size as shown on the site plan. Portions of the site plan do not indicate what they will be, and the proposed conditions then require that those areas that are not building, driveway, or gravel must be either grass or other landscaping.

The property is located in the shoreland overlay district, which permits a maximum amount of impervious surface of 25%. The applicant is proposing to improve the current site situation by removing some of the gravel parking area. The variance is required to be reviewed by the DNR, and comments will be provided when available.

In 2004, the property was the subject of an application for an interim use permit and variance. The applications were ultimately denied after the property owner indicated that he was not inclined to continue the review process. Since that time, various changes have been made to the property without completing site plan review. As a result, the site is not in conformance with zoning ordinance requirements.

Evaluation of Variance Request

In evaluating variance requests, the following questions should be considered:

- 1. Is the request a reasonable use of the land not permitted by the Zoning Ordinance? Staff Note: The use will be contained within the building and is a reasonable use of the land in a commercial district.
- 2. Is the plight of the landowner due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner?

Staff Note: The situation is created by the landowner. The additional impervious surface was added since 2004 and did not receive site plan approval or a variance from the impervious surface requirements of the shoreland district.

3. Will the variance, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality?

Staff Note: The variance will not alter the essential character of the locality. The applicant is proposing to reduce the amount of impervious surface from existing conditions, and also will not have outside storage on the site.

Recommendation on the Variance

The proposed impervious surface is an improvement on the existing condition. It is difficult for a commercial site, particularly within a downtown area to be limited to 25% impervious.

Recommendation on Interim Use Permit

It is recommended that the Interim Use Permit be approved, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The only use permitted for the Subject Property is masonry construction trade business or showroom. No other use of the property is permitted except those as permitted in the Cologne Zoning Ordinance as amended from time to time.
- 2. Hours of operation shall not be earlier than 6:30 a.m. and later than 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Saturday hours shall not be earlier than 8:00 a.m. nor later than 2:00 p.m. No operating hours on Sundays or legal holidays are permitted.
- **3.** No outside storage is permitted. All operations and storage of parts and materials shall be conducted within the building shown on the site plan. Outside storage does not include employee and business vehicles, but would include parts, attachments, inoperable vehicles, equipment, materials or any other items that are not affixed to the ground.
- **4.** Customer, employee and company vehicles may be parked outside the building either on the cement driveway in front of the building or on the gravel area on the east side of the building. Not more than 10 company vehicles may be permitted to be parked outside. A company vehicle can be a truck, trailer, dump truck, etc. A truck with trailer attached counts as 2 company vehicles.
- 5. The site must be maintained in compliance with the Site Plan prepared by Premier Land Surveying, LLC and dated July 9, 2020. Areas that are not specified as being either building, concrete driveway, or gravel shall consist of grass, trees, bushes or other landscaping. The Site Plan may not be amended unless a new Site Plan is approved in conformance with city ordinances.
- **6.** The use and site shall be in compliance with all requirements of the zoning ordinance, as amended from time to time.
- 7. The use and site shall maintain compliance with all noise and nuisance related ordinances of the City Code, as may be amended from time to time.
- **8.** The use and site shall be in compliance with any Federal, State or County law or regulation that is applicable and any related permits shall be obtained and documented to the City.
- **9.** Disposal and handling of all waste and hazardous materials shall be done in conformance with law.
- 10. A lapse of one year during which the premises are not used for the purposes provided for in this permit shall cause the permit to expire and be of no further consequence.
- 11. This Interim Use Permit shall terminate on August 4, 2025. If this type of use is still eligible to be permitted as an interim use under city ordinances

near the time of expiration of this permit, the applicant may apply for a new interim use permit.

CITY OF COLOGNE PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 20-01 RESOLUTION APPROVING VARIANCE FOR 218 LAKE STREET WEST

WHEREAS, Jensen Decorative Concrete, Inc. ("Applicant") is the applicant for an application related to property located at 218 Lake Street West: and

WHEREAS, the property is zoned C-2 Central Business District; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has applied for a variance related to the amount of impervious surface in the shoreland overlay district; and

WHEREAS, the property is an existing parcel containing a commercial building and parking lots in the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, the shoreland overlay district permits a maximum of 25% impervious surface coverage: and

WHEREAS, the Applicant is proposing a maximum of 52.1% impervious surface coverage, which is a decrease from 55.7% that exists on the site today: and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute Section 462.357, subd. 6 provides:

- a. Variances shall only be permitted (a) when they are in harmony with the general purposes and intent of the ordinance and (b) when the variances are consistent with the comprehensive plan.
- b. Variances may be granted when the applicant for the variance establishes that there are practical difficulties in complying with the zoning ordinance. "Practical difficulties," as used in connection with the granting of a variance, means that (a) the property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by the zoning ordinance; (b) the plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner; and (c) the variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality.

WHEREAS, the public hearing was properly noticed and scheduled for August 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the application was reviewed by the Planning Commission at its meeting on August 3, 2020; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Planning Commission does hereby make the following findings of fact:

1. The proposed variance is a reasonable use of the land. The site contains impervious surface today in excess of the 25% restriction and the Applicant is proposing to decrease the impervious surface on the property from the existing conditions. The site is zoned C-2 Central Business District and is within the original plat of the City. It is typical, particularly within older parcels of record, to have impervious surface that is in excess of the 25% requirement given the typical historical development of central business districts which may approach 100% impervious.

- 2. The plight of the landowner is due to circumstances created by the landowner but are not unique to the property. The lot is a typical property in the Central Business District
- 3. The variance would alter the essential character of the locality. The amount of impervious surface is in character with the Central Business District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Commission hereby approves the application to issue a variance to permit the site to have impervious surface coverage not to exceed 52.1%.

CITY OF COLOGNE CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA RESOLUTION NO. 20-17

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERIM USE PERMIT FOR 218 LAKE STREET WEST

WHEREAS, the City of Cologne is a Minnesota Municipal Corporation, duly organized and authorized to conduct its affairs under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, Jensen Decorative Concrete, Inc, a Minnesota business corporation (the "Applicant") is the proposed purchaser of certain real property located in the City of Cologne, State of Minnesota, located at 218 Lake Street West (the "Subject Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City did on August 3, 2020, conduct a public hearing in relation to the Applicant's request for an interim use permit; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City did on August 3, 2020 recommend approval of the interim use permit to the City Council; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the interim use permit is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The only use permitted for the Subject Property is masonry construction trade business or showroom. No other use of the property is permitted except those as permitted in the Cologne Zoning Ordinance as amended from time to time.
- 2. Hours of operation shall not be earlier than 6:30 a.m. and later than 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Saturday hours shall not be earlier than 8:00 a.m. nor later than 2:00 p.m. No operating hours on Sundays or legal holidays are permitted.
- 3. No outside storage is permitted. All operations and storage of parts and materials shall be conducted within the building shown on the site plan. Outside storage does not include employee and business vehicles, but would include parts, attachments, inoperable vehicles, equipment, materials or any other items that are not affixed to the ground.
- **4.** Customer, employee and company vehicles may be parked outside the building either on the cement driveway in front of the building or on the gravel area on the east side of the building. Not more than 10 company vehicles may be permitted to be parked outside. A company vehicle can be a truck, trailer, dump truck, etc. A truck with trailer attached counts as 2 company vehicles.

- 5. The site must be maintained in compliance with the Site Plan prepared by Premier Land Surveying, LLC and dated July 9, 2020. Areas that are not specified as being either building, concrete driveway, or gravel shall consist of grass, trees, bushes or other landscaping. The Site Plan may not be amended unless a new Site Plan is approved in conformance with city ordinances.
- **6.** The use and site shall be in compliance with all requirements of the zoning ordinance, as amended from time to time.
- 7. The use and site shall maintain compliance with all noise and nuisance related ordinances of the City Code, as may be amended from time to time.
- **8.** The use and site shall be in compliance with any Federal, State or County law or regulation that is applicable and any related permits shall be obtained and documented to the City.
- 9. Disposal and handling of all waste and hazardous materials shall be done in conformance with law.
- 10. A lapse of one year during which the premises are not used for the purposes provided for in this permit shall cause the permit to expire and be of no further consequence.
- 11. This Interim Use Permit shall terminate on August 4, 2025. If this type of use is still eligible to be permitted as an interim use under city ordinances near the time of expiration of this permit, the applicant may apply for a new interim use permit.

ORDINANCE NO. 168

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING NONESSENTIAL WATER USAGE UPON CRITICAL WATER DEFICIENCY AS AUTHORIZED BY MINN. STAT. § 103G.291, SUBD. 1 AND 2.

The City Council of Cologne, Minnesota ordains:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

This ordinance establishes water conservation restrictions; and the plan will be in effect at any time the governor declares by executive order a critical water deficiency, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 103G.291.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

- **2.1 Clerk** in statutory cities means the person assigned duties pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 412.151; or the city manager pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 412.601 412.751 or in charter cities as determined by city charter.
- **2.2 Department** means the city water department.
- **2.3 Emergency** means the declaration of a critical water deficiency by the governor.
- **2.4 Irrigation** means the watering of shrubs, trees, sod, seeded areas, gardens, lawns, or any other outdoor vegetation, except outdoor vegetation utilized for agricultural purposes.
- **2.5 Notification to public** means notification through local media, including interviews and issuance of news releases.
- **2.6 Public water supplier** means the city or other entity that owns, manages, or operates a public water supply, as defined in Minn. Stat. § 144.382, subdivision 4.
- **2.7 Reclaimed water** means water collected from rooftops, paved surfaces, or other collection devices and all water utilized more than once before re-entering the natural water cycle.
- **2.8 Water recirculation system** means any system which enables a user to reuse water at least once prior to returning the water to the natural water cycle.

SECTION 3. APPLICATION.

- **3.1** This ordinance applies to all customers of public water suppliers who own or control water use on any premises.
- **3.2** No person shall make, cause, use, or permit the use of water received from a public water supply for residential, commercial, industrial, governmental, or any other purpose in any manner contrary to any provision in this ordinance.

3.3 Mandatory emergency conservation measures shall be implemented based upon the declaration of a critical water emergency by the governor.

SECTION 4. DECLARATION OF CRITICAL WATER DEFICIENCY.

Upon the declaration of a critical water deficiency by the governor, the public water supplier shall immediately post notice of the emergency declaration at the usual meeting place of the city council, or the official city bulletin board. The city shall provide notification to the public as quickly as possible or through established water supply plans emergency response plans or procedures.

SECTION 5. MANDATORY EMERGENCY WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES.

Upon declaration of a water emergency and notification to the public, the following mandatory restrictions upon nonessential water use shall be enforced:

- (1) Outdoor irrigation of yards, gardens, golf courses, parklands, and other non-agricultural land, except for those areas irrigated with reclaimed water, is prohibited.
- (2) Washing or spraying of sidewalks, driveways, parking areas, tennis courts, patios, or other paved areas with water from any pressurized source, including garden hoses, except to alleviate immediate health or safety hazards, is prohibited.
- (3) The outdoor use of any water-based play apparatus connected to a pressurized source is prohibited.
- (3) Restaurants and other food service establishments are prohibited from serving water to their customers, unless water is specifically requested by the customer.
- (5) Operation of outdoor misting systems used to cool public areas is prohibited.
- (6) The filling of swimming pools, fountains, spas, or other exterior water features is prohibited.
- (7) The washing of automobiles, trucks, trailers, and other types of mobile equipment is prohibited, except at facilities equipped with wash water recirculation systems, and for vehicles requiring frequent washing to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

SECTION 6. VARIANCES.

The City Clerk or their designee, is authorized to grant variances to this ordinance where strict application of its provisions would result in serious hardship to a customer. A variance may be granted only for reasons involving health or safety. An applicant may appeal the denial of a variance within five (5) days of the decision by submitting a written appeal to the City Clerk. The City Council shall hear the appeal at the next City Council meeting. The decision of the City Council is final.

SECTION 7. VIOLATION.

- **7.1** Violations shall be determined and cited by the City Clerk or his/her designee. A violator may appeal the citation within five (5) days of its issuance by submitting a written appeal to the City. The City Council shall hear the appeal at the next City Council meeting. The decision of the City Council is final. Violators may be granted an administrative waiver if evidence is provided that equipment failure was the cause of the violation. A letter from a qualified vendor or equipment invoice will be required to show proof of equipment failure.
- **7.2** Upon discovery of a first violation, the violator shall be issued, either personally or by mail, a warning letter that sets forth the violation and which shall describe the remedy and fines for future violations.
- **7.3** Upon subsequent violations at the same location, the violator shall be issued, either personally or by mail, a citation that sets forth the violation and shall describe the remedy. Fines shall be added to the monthly water bill of the owner or current occupant of the premises where the violation occurred. The imposition of the fine shall in no way limit the right of the City to pursue other legal remedies.

SECTION 8. ENFORCEMENT.

The City Clerk or his/her designee is authorized to designate city employees or law enforcement personnel to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this ordinance or the application of any provision to a particular situation is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of the ordinance and the application of the ordinance to any other situation shall not be invalidated.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.
