a. Transportation Study Open House Summary

Jack Corkle from WSB and Angie Stenson from Carver County shared updates with the Council on a recent Open House where transportation and various road upgrades and redesigns were discussed with the public. Next steps include developing an implementation plan with timelines.

b. Cologne Fire Department - LaFrance Restoration

Chief Chad Vos updated the council on the LaFrance Restoration project noting that the individual who will do the restoration is now ready to take on the project. Motion by Councilmember Kells to approve the contract with Hal Fillinger Vintage Vehicle Restorations to restore the LaFrance Fire Truck, second by Councilmember Szaroletta. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Councilmember Bruss to approve payment of the \$20,000 deposit for the LaFrance Restoration, second by Councilmember Kells. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Strategic Planning Scope of Work

Administrator Dickson reviewed a proposal from WSB for Strategic Planning work with the City. After discussion Councilmember Bruss made a motion to engage WSB to provide strategic planning with the City Council and City staff at a cost of \$10,5000, second by Councilmember Lenzen. Motion carried unanimously.
