The Cologne Community of Belonging initiative continues to take action to enhance connection and communication throughout the greater Cologne community. SAFETY AND EFFICIENCIES

Earlier this winter, Carver County, the City of Cologne and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MNDOT) hosted a community Open House to discuss the recent Transportation Study and potential options for the Cologne Area Transportation Plan.

The purpose of the study and discussion of proposed options is to identify a coordinated transportation system vision with recommendations for short, midand long-term transportation improvements for State, County, and City roadways in and around the City of Cologne.



- Local city collector streets



Next Steps

Incorporating input from residents and other stakeholders, the next steps from the County/City/MNDOT are to develop a draft implementation plan – identifying alternatives for future consideration, potential timing of improvements and responsible parties – for discussion in February and March, with final plan approval in June 2023.

MODERN DESIGN CELEBRATES 31 YEARS IN LOCAL BUSINESS

Congratulations to Modern Design – one of the largest

custom cabinetry shops in Minnesota – its owners and employees for celebrating 31 years in local business.



Owners Troy and Jo Eiden started their Modern Design business in 1991, just outside of Cologne on Troy's parents farm on County Road 140, with just three employees. They soon outgrew their location and moved into the former lumberyard location in downtown Cologne (209 Paul Ave. South) in 2000.

"We were nervous to take that big step, but so glad we did. It's been a great space and location for us, and we've added on five times over the years," Jo said. The largest addition was in 2019, nearly doubling its size. Modern Design continues to grow, now employing 60 employees – five of whom work in the Norwood Young America location (opened in 2021) – as well as opening a showroom in Rochester in 2021.
