City resident Janice Vos shared her concerns over a neighbor's weeds and plans to place a fence on the property line. The Mayor advised that the Council was addressing the weeds with the destruction order that had been added to the agenda, and the current ordinance does allow for a fence to be placed directly on the property line. Ms

Vos also asked if a permit was required to build a play structure with a tower and how far it had to be off the property line.

6. NEW COUNCIL BUSINESS

i. Chief Chad Vos, Cologne Fire & Rescue

1. Fire Department Probation Promotions

Fire Chief Chad Vos introduced the Probationary Fire Fighters Nick Burkhalter, Nick Lueck and Carter Milbrett and reviewed the training they have undergone in the past year. Chief's Loscheider and Clay joined Chief Vos to had out their official firefighter badges and helmet fronts. The Council congratulated the candidates on their promotions and thanked them for their service.

2. Grass Rig

Chief Vos updated the Council on the department's firefighting fleet stating that the new tanker is on order and will be delivered in September of 2024. The staff has been working on grant requests to help with obtaining funds to replace the grass rig. The DNR has reached out to Chief Vos about an available 10-year-old truck that could be purchased for \$7,500. Motion by Councilmember Bruss to approve the purchase of the DNR truck at a cost of \$7,500, second by Councilmember Szaroletta. Motion carried 4-0.

Chief Vos told the Council that a committee of fire fighters has been formed to interview different consulting groups to help the department plan for growth in the City and options for dealing with space constraints in the department.

ii. Ordinance 150-Y

Administrator Dickson updated the council on discussions he had with City Planner Cindy Nash regarding a full review of the City Ordinances and Zoning to align with current State Statutes and best practices. Motion by Councilmember Kells to include \$20,000 in the 2024 consulting budget dedicated to a full review and adoption of City Ordinances, second by Councilmember Szaroletta. Motion carried 4-0.

iii. Destruction Order

Administrator Dickson reviewed the City Weed Ordinance and current inspection at 214 Playhouse St E. and the Destruction Order. Motion by Councilmember Bruss to approve the Destruction Order, second by Councilmember Kells. Motion carried 4-0.

The council discussed various options to address the traffic and speed on Village Parkway Administrator Dickson will investigate dropping the speed to 25 miles per hour during posted times at the beginning and end of the school day.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular or special meeting of the City Council of the City of Cologne, Carver County, Minnesota, was duly held on August 21, 2023, at 7:00 P.M.

	RESOLUTION NO. 23-19

APPROVING THE AUTHORIZATION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2023A

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cologne, Minnesota (the "City") as follows:

- 1. The City Council hereby finds and declares that it is necessary and expedient for the City to sell and issue its fully registered General Obligation Improvement Bonds, Series 2023A in the total aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,800,000 (herein, the "Bonds"). The proceeds of the Bonds will be used to finance (i) various street improvement projects; and (ii) associated utility improvement projects.
- 2. The City Council desires to proceed with the sale of the Bonds by a negotiated sale.
- 3. The Mayor and the City Administrator are hereby authorized to approve the sale of the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,800,000.
- 4. The Mayor and the City Administrator are hereby authorized to approve the sale of the Bonds with a total interest cost not to exceed 5.00%.
- 5. Upon approval of the sale of the Bonds by the Mayor and the City Administrator, the City Council will take action at a regular or special scheduled meeting thereafter to adopt the necessary approving resolutions as prepared by the City's bond counsel.

The motion for the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by member and, after a full discussion thereof and upon a vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor thereof:

2024 PROSECUTION CONTRACT

THIS JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT is made and entered into between the Carver County Attorney, the Carver County Board of Commissioners, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, and the City of Cologne, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota, to provide for prosecution of statutory gross misdemeanor, misdemeanor and petty misdemeanor violations, other than liquor law violations directly involving establishments, organizations or individuals with liquor licenses or permits issued by the City of Cologne and also to provide for prosecution of municipal traffic and parking ordinance violations.

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes Section 471.59 authorizes governmental units in the State of Minnesota to enter into agreements by resolution with any other governmental unit to perform on behalf of that unit any service or function which that unit would be authorized to provide for itself; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes Section 484.87, Subdivision 3, provides that statutory gross misdemeanor, misdemeanor, petty misdemeanor violations and municipal ordinance violations in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Scott and Washington shall be prosecuted by the attorney of the municipality where the violation is alleged to have occurred and further provides that municipalities may enter into three party agreements with the County Board and the County Attorney to provide for prosecution services for criminal offenses; and

WHEREAS, each of the parties hereto desires to enter into this Joint Powers Agreement and has, through the actions of its respective governing bodies, been duly authorized to enter into this Joint Powers Agreement for the purposes hereinafter stated;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, it is hereby agreed by and between the County of Carver, through the Board of Commissioners, the Carver County Attorney, and the City of Cologne, through its Council, that:

1. Enabling Authority.

Minnesota Statutes Section 471.59 authorizes two or more governmental units to jointly exercise any power common to the contracting parties. Minnesota Statutes Section 484.87, Subdivision 3 authorizes the City of Cologne to enter into an agreement with the County of Carver and the Office of the Carver County Attorney to provide for prosecution services for criminal offenses.

2. Purpose

Provide for prosecution of statutory gross misdemeanor, misdemeanor and petty misdemeanor violations, other than liquor law violations directly involving establishments, organizations or individuals with liquor licenses or permits issued by the City of Cologne and also to provide for prosecution of municipal traffic and parking ordinance violations.

3. Services.

The Carver County Attorney's Office shall prosecute statutory gross misdemeanor, misdemeanor, petty misdemeanor violations and, any other criminal municipal ordinance violation. The Carver County Attorney shall also prosecute all municipal traffic and parking ordinance violations allegedly occurring within the jurisdiction of the municipality and within Carver County.

4. <u>Term.</u>

Prosecution services shall be rendered by the Carver County Attorney's Office commencing January 1, 2024 and extending through December 31, 2024.

5. Payment for Services.

In consideration for prosecution services being rendered, the County shall collect one-half (1/2) of all funds allocated pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 484.90, Subdivision 6(a)(1) (fines that the court administers allocates 100% to the fines to the city or town in which the offense was committed) and one-third (1/3) allocated pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 484.90, Subdivision 6(a)(2) (fines that the court administers allocates two-thirds to the fines to the city or town in which the offense was committed). An additional surcharge calculated on the percentage of cases and fine revenue in the amount of \$1,083.13 is to be paid by the City of Cologne to the Carver County Attorney's Office in four equal installments on/by April 15, 2024, July 15, 2024, October 15, 2024 and January 15, 2025.

6. Ordinances.

The City shall forward current traffic ordinances to the Carver County Attorney's Office and immediately inform the County Attorney of any changes made during the contract period.

7. Data.

All data collected, created, received, maintained or disseminated in any form for any purposes by the activities of this Agreement is governed by the Minnesota Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statute Section 13, or the appropriate Rules of Court and shall only be shared pursuant to laws governing that particular data.

8. Audit.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 16C.05, Subdivision 5, the parties agree that the State Auditor or any duly authorized representative at that time during normal business hours and as often as they may reasonably deem necessary, shall have access to and the right to examine, audit, excerpt, and transcribe any books, documents, papers, records, etc. which are pertinent to the

accounting practices and procedures related to this Agreement. All such records shall be maintained for a period of six (6) years from the date of termination of this Agreement.

9. Indemnification.

Each party shall be liable for its own acts to the extent provided by law and hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other, its officers and employees against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims or actions, including attorney's fees which the other, its officers and employee may hereafter sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act or omission of the party, its agents, servants or employees, in the execution or performance or failure to adequately perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

It is understood and agreed that liability shall be limited by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466. This Agreement *to* indemnify and hold harmless does not constitute a waiver by any participant *of* limitations on liability provided under Minnesota Statutes Section 466.04.

It is further understood that Minnesota 471.59, Subd. 1a applies to this Agreement. To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the parties pursuant to this Agreement are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity" and it is the intent of the parties that they shall be deemed a "single governmental unit" for the purposes of liability, all as set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 471.59, Subd. la(a); provided further that for purposes of that statute, each party to this Agreement expressly declines responsibility for the acts or omissions of the other party.

Each party agrees to promptly notify the other party if it knows or becomes aware of any facts or allegations reasonably giving rise to actual or potential liability, claims, causes of action, judgments, damages, losses, costs or expenses, including attorney's fees, involving or reasonably likely to involve the other party, and arising out of acts or omissions related to this Agreement.

10. Nonwaiver, Severability and Applicable Laws.

Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver by the parties of any statute of limitation or exceptions on liability.

If any part of this Agreement is deemed invalid such shall not affect the remainder unless it shall substantially impair the value of the Agreement with respect to either party. The parties agree to substitute for the invalid provision a valid one that most closely approximates the intent of the Agreement.

The laws of the State of Minnesota apply to this Agreement.

11. Termination.

This Agreement shall terminate of its own accord without further action taken or notice given by either party at midnight, December 31, 2024.

12. Merger and Modification.

It is understood and agreed that the entire Agreement between the parties is contained herein and that this Agreement supersedes all oral agreements and negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. All items referred to in this Agreement are incorporated or attached and are deemed to be part of this Agreement.

Any alterations, variations, modifications, or waivers of provisions of this Agreement shall only be valid when they have been reduced to writing as an amendment to this Agreement and signed by the parties hereto.

Letter of Credit Reduction Request No 2

Dear Mr. Dickson:

We have reviewed the Letter of Credit reduction requested by Loomis Development in their letter dated August 3, 2023, together with the estimated amount of work remaining on the project as of this writing.

The original Letter of Credit amount was \$2,453,671.75, which includes \$2,413,671.81 for grading and utility improvements and \$40,000 for additional security.

The work remaining on the project includes bituminous wear course, tack coat, casting adjustments, erosion control maintenance and removal, and televising of sanitary and storm sewers. In addition, due to the excessive amount of settlement on the project, temporary repairs prior to winter as well as permanent repairs prior to placement of the wear course are required, as such, we are including 20% of the curb and bituminous base costs in the amount of work remaining.

The bid cost for the work remaining on the project is \$114,835.40. The associated letter of credit amount is \$143,544.25 (\$114,544.25 x 1.25).

The recommended revised Letter of Credit amount is \$143,544.25+\$40,000= **\$183,544.25**.

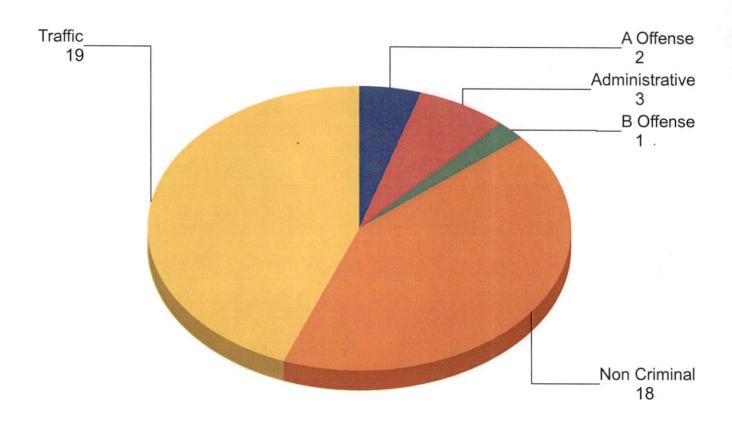

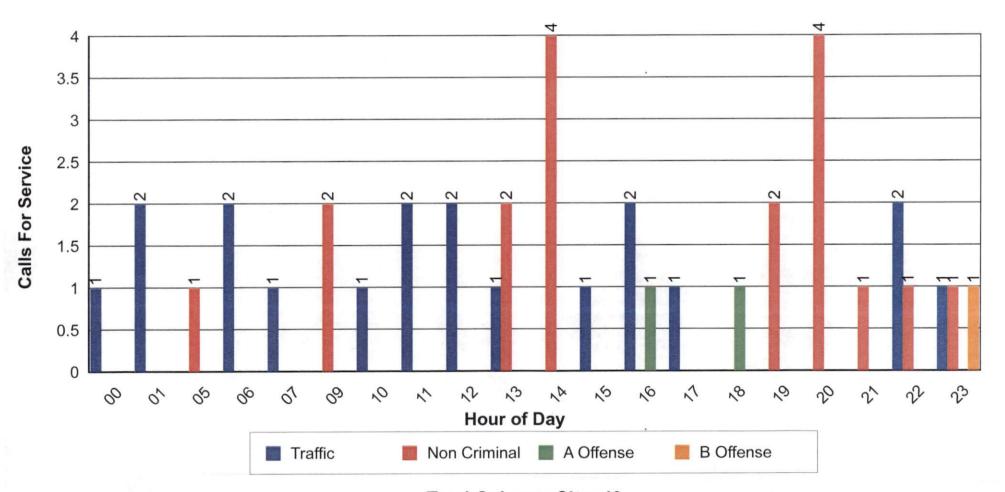
