COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

COLOGNE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT & FIRE RELIEF ASSOCIATION; CELEBRATING 135 YEARS IN 2025 AND 'GIVING BACK'

Founded on Dec. 13, 1890, the Cologne Fire and Rescue Department is one of the oldest fire departments in Minnesota. Its members have served the greater community for 133 years – saving lives and property, providing emergency medical services, protecting the environment during emergencies, providing mutual aid to neighboring Fire Departments, offering fire prevention education, participating in community outreach and more. The 51-square mile Cologne Fire District includes the City of Cologne, and portions of Benton, Dahlgren and Hancock Townships.

Today, the City of Cologne has a paid-on-call (volunteer) Fire Department of 30 firefighters who live or work in the City of Cologne. All members are Firefighter I and Firefighter II certified, as well as First Responder certified. Many are also EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) certified. According to Chief Chad Vos, all new members complete a two-year training of approximately 200 hours learning "how to be a firefighter during year one, and how to be a firefighter in Cologne and be part of our department 'family' in year two. There is a job for everyone at every incident." Every member also completes around 50 hours of continuing education annually through regular trainings.

The Fire Department responds to 911 calls for fire, medical, accidents, storms, rescue and technical services. As Cologne and Carver County have grown, so has the number of calls for Fire Department response. In 2022, there were 141 calls for service; currently, the department is on pace to have nearly 200 calls by year end. According to Chief Vos, more mutual aid calls and



general growth in Cologne and neighboring communities contribute to the increase in calls. "We're fortunate to have great resources and great personnel in our community for response. Outside of call response, we stay busy with fire prevention and community outreach. In October, we visit area schools as well as host a Trick-or Treat event at our station. Our Relief Association keeps us involved in the community by running charitable gambling and holding yearly fundraisers like our Annual Steak Fry in April and calendars that are distributed in September. Funds raised go back into our protection area for scholarships, events and good causes throughout the greater community," Vos said.

"We are your neighbors, friends and families, and we are all proud to serve and give back. We are a service organization as much as an emergency service organization," Vos added. "We've been very fortunate to have our previous department leadership through the decades, making our department what it is today."

Mick Swanson is Cologne's most tenured member, who joined the department nearly 43 years ago when his father and friends were serving. "Many more friends joined me through the years, and we've had many grandfathers, fathers, sons and daughters in our 'fire family.' We are a close-knit group who do the work for the community we love."
