#### **BOUNTIFUL BASKET TO CELEBRATE 1-YEAR ANNIVERSARY**

#### FREEWILL BREAKFAST ON JULY 13; ALL INVITED

Located in the St. Bernard School building (310 Church Street East), the Bountiful Basket Food Shelf will celebrate its one-year anniversary in Cologne on July 13, 2024.

The Cologne Lions Club will help with this celebration by hosting a freewill breakfast on Saturday, July 13, from 8 a.m. to Noon at St. Bernard School. The menu includes pancakes, sausage, coffee/juice and pure maple syrup made by members of the Cologne Lions Club. Donations of cash or non-perishable food products for the food shelf will be accepted.

Bountiful Basket has met an increasing community need, growing from 23 shopper visits in its first month (July 2023) to now serving up to 65 families each week. Through February 2024, the Cologne food shelf and its volunteers have distributed 52,163 pounds of food to shoppers – an average of 21.58 pounds per shopper. Local businesses have also provided rescue food and gas cards to help shoppers. Below are two of the many notes of gratitude from shoppers:
