SUBJECT: NEW FUND DISCUSSION AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

CONTRIBUTIONS

DATE: 10/31/2025

When preparing the budget for 2025 we had a conversation about the existing Capital Improvement Plan that tracks upcoming major purchases and sets targets for a year of purchase. The Plan contained both city wide and fire department specific purchases.

After discussions with our Auditors, I am recommending that we establish two new funds and break up the existing Plan into two tracking documents.

The *Fire Department Capital Fund* will likely start with an initial deposit of \$388,673.13 (see Fire Equipment Reserve Detail following this memo) The city has been diligent in committing funds via resolution to be held for future fire equipment expenses. After much discussion with the townships we serve, 2 of the 3 entities have chosen a new way to pay for annual fire services that has the potential for them to set aside some dollars in this fund – that will be tracked and used to reduce their individual share of future capital expenditures. You can see on the reserve detail that Benton and Hancock will have \$11,569.89 and \$2,811.82 respectively deposited from their 2025 Township billing because of this change.

The Fire Department Capital Fund will have both revenue and expense accounts established to keep the transactions out of the General Fund allowing for a much better picture of the daily operating expenses of the city.

The *City Capital Improvement Fund* will likely start with an initial deposit of \$639,309. Like the Fire Department Capital Fund, this fund will have both revenue and expense accounts established to keep the transactions out of the General Fund.

Capital Improvement Contribution Discussion: When the Council approved the 2025 budget a significant change was made by adding an annual contribution to help build up the funds for the large purchases. I have kept the \$100,000 contribution in the 2026

budget. I would like direction from the Council on how to allocate those dollars between these two new funds.

Following are 3 documents to start some discussion:

- 1) The original Capital Improvement Worksheet with City and CFD purchases combined
- 2) Proposed City Capital Improvement Plan Worksheet
- 3) Proposed CFD Equipment Capital Improvement Plan Worksheet

You will see that in my proposed worksheets; I have split the \$100,000 contribution as depositing \$80,000 in the City CIP and \$20,000 in the CFD CIP as a starting point for the discussion.

RECOMMENDATION: Provide staff direction on how to distribute the funds for 2026 between the two new funds

Re: Administrator Update

In addition to items presented in the packet please see the following notes of interest:

- I received the Sanitary Survey Report for the public water supply inspection that was completed this year. No deficiencies were noted needing to be corrected.
- I received the 2025 System Statements from the Metropolitan Council this is in response to Imagine 2050 which requires Policies and Plans around transportation, parks and trails, water, housing and land use. This triggers the timeline for us to update our comprehensive plan which is due to the Met Council by December 31, 2028. Information has been passed on to Cindy Nash to begin the project.
- The Mn House of Reps Capitol Investment Committee stopped by City Hall on Thursday October 23rd to hear from us about our WWTP Improvement Project and Funding request. Jake Saulsbury and Meghan Brockman from Bolton and Menk presented along with Sarah Bruss. My general feeling from conversations in the room that day was that there is very little money to give out in this upcoming session. No decisions will be made until next spring at the earliest.

- The CFD fall meeting with the townships was held on Tuesday evening October 28th at 7:00 pm
- Payment request was made to the EPA for reimbursement from the grant funds we were awarded for the North Water Tower refurbishing project.
- Certified the cost of demolition of 111 John Ave S in the amount of \$33,674.57 to the property for collection in 2026 as a special assessment.
