SUBJECT: TRUTH IN TAXATION HEARING

DATE: 11/18/2025

The Council and I met at our October 20th Budget Workshop to discuss the preliminary budget and debt service levy components that made up the preliminary levy adopted in September of \$2,199,506 – a 9.81% increase.

As we discussed when developing last year's budget -2026 will be year two of a 5-year balloon payment on the outstanding debt from construction of the Community Center and Village Parkway. The balloon payment equates to a 34% increase in the debt payment or roughly a \$183,000 annual increase in the payment. In 2026, as in 2025, I am not proposing to levy for the full amount of the debt service, rather we will use reserve funds to cover the shortfall.

In working towards the final levy, we removed \$100,000 in engineering from the operating budget that was earmarked for Village Parkway this reduces the operating levy increase to \$42,643. The total increase in dollars toward the debt service levy is \$76,500. The change from preliminary to final levy is a net dollar increase of \$119,143 equating to a 5.9% increase from 2025.


The annual tax impact on a \$400,00 home is \$142.


RECOMMENDATION:

SUBJECT: INCREASING BENEFIT LEVEL FOR FIREFIGHTERS VESTED IN

THE STATEWIDE VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER PLAN

DATE: 11/25/2025

Fire Chief Vos has met with both Mayor Lein and I on multiple occasions in the past few months to discuss an increase in the Benefit Level for Firefighters enrolled in PERA. The Relief Association joined PERA in 2023 and at that time the benefit level went from \$1,750 per year of service to \$2,500 per year of service.

The City receives an Actuarial Valuation for the plan annually to assess the financial health of the plan. The Valuation looks at the assets, and accrued liability for all firefighters in the plan and determines the *funded ratio*. The most recent valuation indicates that the plan has a funded ratio of 108%.

The State provides cities with State Aid annually, that is deposited directly into the plan and is intended to help cover the growth in the liability each year as the years of service increase. The most recent state aid plus the supplemental state aid was \$36,691. In addition to State Aid, there are earnings annually on the assets in the fund which in the last valuation were \$71,274. These two amounts total an annual increase in the assets of \$107,965. (36,691 + 71,274). The annual increase in the liability if we move to \$2,750 is \$90,750. (33 firefighters x \$2,750).

Firefighters are eligible to receive their pension in a lump sum payment once they have 20 years of service and are at least 50 years old. There are currently 7 firefighters that are eligible to receive the payout. The combined years of service should they take the payout in 2026 is 235 years. While I do not anticipate all 7 taking the payout in 2026, if they did, the payout would be \$646,250 and the projected assets of the fund would drop from \$1,187,907 to \$541,657. This decrease in assets decreases the ability for earnings on the funds and could result in the funded ratio dropping to 95%.

PERA also provides data on all city Volunteer Fire Departments Benefit Levels and Funded Ratios. Only 7% of cities are under 100% funded. Over 50% of the

cities in PERA are over 131% funded. I believe the Council should have some discussion on establishing what a target funded ratio should be. While our current 108% funded ratio may sound sufficient, it is on the low side of what other cities are able to maintain to keep their fund at a healthy level.

Of the 279 Cities with PERA plans for their volunteer Fire Departments, the benefit levels range from \$500 - \$13,800 per year of service. The average is \$2,477. Below is a chart with some nearby cities and some other cities that are similar in population to compare benefit levels.

The Council should focus on two things when adjusting the Benefit Level for its volunteer firefighters.

- Is the benefit fair and competitive with similar sized cities and,
- Is the cost to provide the benefit reasonable and sustainable given the city's budget

The actuarial valuation indicated that an increase to \$2,700 would not require an additional contribution from the city and would result in a decrease in our funded ratio to 101.79%. I believe going to \$2,750 would maintain the funded ratio around the 100% level. Again, when firefighters start drawing their benefit payout, the funded ratio will likely be impacted.

RECOMMENDATION:

I believe a move to the \$2,750 per year of service provides a 10% increase over the existing benefit and is also 11% over the average benefit level in the state. The change will lower our funded ratio but appears to be at a level that is sustainable with the State Aid Contributions and investment earnings on the assets in the plan.

- 1) The City hereby approves an increase in the benefit level for firefighters who have completed at least 5 years of good time service credit as a member of the Statewide Volunteer Firefighter Plan administered by PERA at the \$2,750 pension level per year of service, effective January 1, 2026; and
- 2) The City Clerk and Mayor are hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.






